**Question:** What is Iqaamat?

**Answer:** Iqaamat is the announcement of Salaah, which signals that the Fard Salaah is about to commence.

**Question:** Is the Iqaamat given in the same manner and with the same words as the Azaan?

**Answer:** The Iqaamat is similar to the Azaan. In other words, the rules mentioned in Azaan are also applicable in the case of Iqaamat, with certain differences.

**Question:** What are the differences between the Azaan and the Iqaamat?

**Answer:** The differences are as follows:

In the Iqaamat, after the 'Falaah' the Mu'azzin will proclaim twice,

قَدُقَامَتِ الصَّلُوةُ

**Qad Qaamatis Salaat** 

**Prayer is About To Commence** 

- Even though the Iqaamat is proclaimed audibly, but it should not be as loud as the Azaan. In other words, it should be loud enough for those present to hear it.
- The words of the Iqaamat should be proclaimed rapidly and there should be no pause in-between like in the Azaan.
- Neither should the hands be placed over the ears, nor should the fingers be thrust into the ears.
- The words 'As Salaatu Khairum-Minan Nawm' will not be proclaimed in the Iqaamat of Fajr Salaah as it is done in the Azaan of Fajr.
- It is not Sunnat to call out the Iqaamat on an elevated platform or from outside the Masjid.

**Question:** If the person calling out the Iqaamat is the same person who will perform the Imaamat, but he is not as yet on the Imaamat Musallah, when should he step on to the Musallah?

**Answer:** If the Imam is the one who has called out the Iqaamat then whilst saying 'Qad Qaamatis Salaat' he should proceed onto the Musallah, i.e. the Prayer mat. [Bahaar with Ref to. Durr-e-Mukhtar, Alamgiri, Ghuniya etc.]

**Question:** Does the Mu'azzin have to turn his face to the right and left in Iqaamat as well?

**Answer:** Yes, the Mu'azzin should turn his face to the right and left when proclaiming the Hay'ya 'alas Salaat and the Hay'ya 'alal Falaah. [Bahaar with Ref. to Durr-e-Mukhtar]

**Question:** Can anyone call out the Iqaamat without the permission of the duly appointed Mu'azzin?

**Answer:** If the Mu'azzin is present and one wishes to proclaim the Iqaamat, he should first seek the permission of the Mu'azzin before doing so. This is the right of the Mu'azzin. If one proclaims it without his permission and the Mu'azzin was offended by it, then it is Makruh to do so. [Bahaar with Ref. to Alamgiri]

**Question:** Nowadays, at many places it has become the norm for everyone to stand up the moment the Iqaamat commences. In certain places unless the Imam does not stand on the Musallah, the Iqaamat is not proclaimed. When should one stand during the Iqaamat?

Answer: This is contrary to the Sunnah. Even if a person entered while the Iqaamat is being proclaimed, it is Makruh for him to stand while the Iqaamat is being proclaimed. He should sit down. He should only stand when the Mu'azzin says Hay'ya 'alal Falaah. Similarly, those people who are in the Masjid should also remain seated, and when the one calling out the Takbeer, i.e. the Iqaamat, and when he says Hay'ya 'alal Falaah, then only should they stand. The same ruling applies to the Imam. Some books have mentioned that one should stand when Hay'ya 'alas Salaah is proclaimed, thus one should rather commence to stand at the end of Hay'ya 'alas Salaah being proclaimed, and stand upright at the commencement of Hay'ya 'alal Falaah. [Bahaar with Ref. to Alamgiri & Fatawa Razviyyah]

**Question:** How should we reply to the Azaan?

**Answer:** On hearing the Azaan, we are instructed to reply to the Azaan. In other words, the one listening to the Azaan should repeat what the Mu'azzin said, after he has said it.

However, in response to 'Hay'ya 'alas Salaat' and 'Hay'ya 'alal Falaah' he should say **'La Hawla Wa La Quw'wata il'la Bil'laah'** and it is better to say both and to add these words as well,

#### Masha Allahu Kaana Wa Ma Lam Yasha Lam Yakun

Question: Is there a reply to As Salaatu Khairum-Minan Nawm?

**Answer:** Yes, in reply to As Salaatu Khairum-Minan Nawm, one should say,

Sadaqta Wa Bararta wa Bil Haq'qi Nataqta

You have spoken the truth and confirmed a virtuous deed

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**Question:** Should one say or do anything when the Mu'azzin during Azaan and Iqaamat says,

## اَشُهَدُ اَنَّ مُحَبَّدًا رَّسُولُ اللهِ

#### Ash-Hadu An'na Muhammadar Rasoolullah

Answer: Yes, indeed. When the Mu'azzin says اَشُهُانَا صَّعَتَهَا رَّسُوْلُ اللهِ 'Ash Hadu An'na Muhammadar Rasoolullah', the listener should recite Durood Shareef. It is Mustahab to kiss the thumbs and place them over the eyes, by saying,

## قُرَّةٌ عَيْنِي بِكَ يَا رَسُولَ اللهِ ٱللهُمَّ مَتِعْنِي بِاالسَّمْعِ وَالْبَصِ

#### Qurratu 'Ayni Bika Ya Rasool-Allah Allahum'ma Mati'ni Bis Sam'i wal Basari

Ya Rasool'Allah **\*\*!** You are the Coolness of my eyes.

O Allah, bless me with appreciating the ability to see and hear.

**Question:** The deviants, i.e. budmazhabs, object to us kissing our thumbs and placing them over our eyes when we hear the name of Nabi &. Is there any evidence to the permissibility of kissing the thumbs when hearing the blessed name of Nabi Kareem &?

**Answer:** Those who object (to kissing the thumbs) are deprived of this special blessing, and those who practice it are indeed blessed. There is sufficient evidence in this regard. Here we will only present one piece of evidence.

It is mentioned in Tafseer Roohul Bayaan that the Beloved Rasool & entered the Masjid and sat down near a pillar. Hazrat Abu Bakr Siddique was also seated beside Him &.

Hazrat Bilal مَنْ الله stood up and commenced with the Azaan. When he proclaimed the words الشَّهَ لُ اَنَّ مُحَتَّدُا الله Hazrat Abu Bakr Siddique مَنْ الله placed both his thumb nails over his eyes and said, 'Qurratu 'Ayni Bika Ya Rasool-Allah, i.e. Ya Rasool-Allah ﴿ You are the Coolness of my eye.

When Hazrat Bilal فالمنافق had completed the Azaan, the Beloved Rasool said, 'O' Abu Bakr! Almighty Allah will forgive the sins of whosoever does like you have done.' [Tafseer Rooh ul Bayaan]

**Question:** Like the Azaan, will one reply to the Iqaamat as well?

**Answer:** Replying to the Iqaamat is Mustahab and to reply to the Azaan is the same. The only difference is that in reply to the words Qad Qaamatis Salaah, the listener should say,

Aqamahal'laahu Wa Admaha Ma Daamatis-Samawaati Wal Ard

Allah keep it established, and keep it forever established as long as the sky and earth are established

One may also say,



#### Aqamahal'laahu wa Admaha Wa Ja'alna min Saalihi Ahliha Ahya-aw Wa Amwaata

## Allah keep it established, and keep it forever, and keep us from amongst the honourable ones in life and after death

**Question:** What is the Dua after the Azaan, and which is the best Dua that one may read after the Azaan?

Answer: There are many narrations with regards to the Dua after Azaan. It is reported in Bukhari, Abu Dawud, Tirmizi, Nasa'i, Ibn Majah and Ahmed from Hazrat Jaabir ناف that Rasoolullah الله said, 'My intercession is Waajib, i.e. compulsory, upon that person who hears the Azaan and then reads this Dua':

Imam Ahmed, Abu Dawud, Tirmizi and Nasa'i have reported from Hazrat Ibn Umar نه الله تعلى that Rasoolullah الله said, 'Reply to the Mu'azzin, then send Durood upon me, and then seek my Wasila'.

Another prescribed Dua is as follows:

اَللَّهُمَّ رَبَّ هٰذِهِ الدَّعُوةِ التَّامَةِ وَالصَّلُوةِ الْقَائِمَةِ الْ سَيِّدِنَا مُحَمَّدَ فِ الْوَسِيلة وَالْفَضِيْلَةَ وَالدَّرَجَةَ الرَّفِيْعَةَ وَابْعَثُهُ مَقَامًا مَحْمُوْدَ فِ الَّذِي وَعَدُتَهُ وَاجَعَلْنَا فِي شَفَاعَتِهِ يَوْمَ الْقِلْمَةِ إِنَّكَ لَا تُخْلِفُ الْبِيْعَادَ Allahum'ma Rab'ba Haazihi Da'watit Taam'mati Was Salaatil Qaa'imati Aati Say'yidana Muhammadanil Waseelata Wa Fadeelata Wad'darajatar Rafee'ata Wab'ath'hu Maqaamam Mahmoodanil Lazee Wa Adtahu Wa Ja'alna Fi Shafa'atihi Yaumal Qiyaamati In'naka La Tukhliful Mi'aad

O Allah, You are The Supreme Rub of this ever-establishing prayer, and of this perfect call. Grant our Master Muhammad Allah 'Allah', i.e. the loftiest position of intercession, and 'Allah', i.e. Special Excellence, and the Highest Rank, and elevate him to 'Maqaam Allahmud', i.e. an exclusively praiseworthy superiority, reserved only for Him which You have Promised, and bring forth for us His intercession on the last day. Undoubtedly, You do not do anything against Your Promise.

**Question:** Some people have a habit of talking during the Azaan and Igaamat, especially of worldly things. Is this permitted?

**Answer:** This is not permitted without valid reason. There is the fear that one who talks during Azaan will die a bad death (Allah Forbid).

It is even impermissible for the congregation to reply to the Azaan of the Khutbah with the tongue, i.e. audibly.

**Question:** We sometimes notice at some Masaajid the words; As Salaatu was Salaamu Alaika Ya Rasool-Allah are mentioned between the Azaan and the Iqaamat or after the Azaan. Is this permitted?

**Answer:** This is permissible and is called 'Tasweeb'. The Shari'at has not specified any words for this, but it has been mentioned in the books of Figh that the commonly used words are,

'As Salaatu As Salaatu, Ya Qaamat Ya Qaamat' or 'As Salaatu Was Salaamu Alaika Ya Rasool-Allah 🐉.'

It must be noted that there is no Tasweeb after the Azaan of Maghrib.
